

Dr. Aiming LIN is currently a professor of Geosciences at the Graduate School of Science and Technology, the Shizuoka University, Japan. He obtained his BSc in Earth Science from the Nanjing University in 1982, and Ph.D in 1992 in Earthquake Geology and Geophysics from the Earthquake Research Institute, University of Tokyo. He has been working on earthquake geology and active Neotectonism in the Tibetan Plateau and Japanese Island. He is particularly interested in the rupture dynamics and mechanics of large earthquakes, tectonic history of active faults and formation mechanisms of fault rocks generated as “Fossil Earthquakes” within seismogenic fault zones from brittle to ductile regimes.
