

YUAN-TSEH LEE

Born in Taiwan in 1936, Yuan T. Lee received his B.S. degree from Taiwan Univ. in 1959 and Doctorate from UC Berkeley in 1965. He joined Prof. Dudley Herschbach at Harvard as a post-doctoral fellow in 1967. After being appointed Assistant Prof. at the Univ. of Chicago in 1968, he rapidly made his laboratory a major center for molecular beam study in North America. He returned to Berkeley as Prof. of Chemistry in 1974. He was Univ. Prof. and Principal Investigator at Lawrence Berkeley Laboratory, UC Berkeley, before he became President of Academia Sinica in 1994. He has become President Emeritus of Academia Sinica since 2006. In 2008 he was elected to be the next president of the International Council for Science (ICSU). He has received numerous awards and honors, including 1986 Nobel Prize in Chemistry, U.S. National Medal of Science, Faraday Medal, Jawaharlal Nehru Birth Centenary Medal, Othmer Gold Medal, and Doctor Honoris Causa from 37 universities.
