J. R. Jokipii is a Regents' Professor of Planetary Sciences and Astronomy at the University of Arizona. He received his undergraduate degree from the University of Michigan in 1961 and a Ph.D. from the California Institute of Technology in 1965. He held professorial posts at the University of Chicago and the California Institute of Technology before moving to Arizona in 1974. He has served on a number of NASA and US National Academy of Sciences committees. He is a Fellow of both the American Physical Society and the American Geophysical Union. He was elected to the U. S. National Academy of Sciences in 2001 and was elected a Lifetime National Associate of the U. S. National Research Council in 2008. Jokipii has published scientific papers in the general fields of cosmic-ray physics, plasma astrophysics and space physics. His current major interests lie in the areas of particle acceleration and the outer heliosphere.
